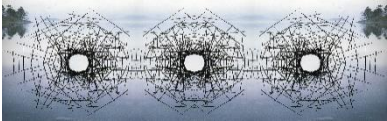


EYFS Elm Class Home Learning Activity Grid

Maths Can you make a toy shop? Make price labels and practise writing numbers. Use words coin,pound,change when you play. Order them backwards or in twos. Make a number line in a different way – with toy cars or pairs of socks? Add and subtract along the number line. Communication and Language

Play games such as 'Whats Missing?' (put items on a tray and then take one away)
Listen to a story without pictures. Either a chapter book, especially if you have older children or listen to one of the many stories on BBC schools radio.

When talking to your children, don't over do the questions, use phrases such as 'I wonder...' or a good rule of thumb is try 4 statements before a question.

Develop children's own narrative language by writing down stories for their small world play (play mobile, lego, action figures) scenarios. Some children might want to try their own stories or write labels.

When reading, talk about the characters, why they acted in a particular way, where they might be going, what they might be thinking? Talk to develop comprehension and let children explain their ideas and thinking rather than closed questioning with a right answer.

Physical Development

Gross motor skills – create an exercise routine involving star jumps/balancing/stretches.

Fine motor skills – colouring and drawing refines pencil control.

Encourage children to colour in the lines by colouring with them.

Practise letter formation on lined paper using a whoosh.

Cut out pictures from magazines to practise cutting skills.



Make sandwiches together and let children use a knife independently to spread butter or cut cucumber.

Phonics

Get a selection of objects or toys in a bag (ones that can be sounded out pig,dog,pen,box) ask children to pick one and spell it.

Try putting on a tray, take one away, can you write the missing item? Use phonic knowledge when writing simple sentences.

The fat cat sat on a mat.

The red car is in the car park.

Revise digraphs taught so far
ch,sh,th,ck,ng,ai,ee,oo,ll,ss,ar,

Write a word/draw a picture for each sound and make a poster.
